The Central Coast Railway Club was founded at San Jose, California in January, 1952. We promote educational and historical study of railroads, and further the railfan hobby through organized discussion and activities of railroad interest.

The Central Coast Railway Club is affiliated with the National Railway Historical Society in 1968 as the Central Coast Chapter. The National Railway Historical Society has 17,000 members in 163 chapters throughout the United States, and in Canada, Japan, and the United Kingdom.

Excursions: Ever since the chapter was founded we have operated special excursions and field trips to points of rail interest in the Western United States to study, learn about and record information on these railroads. Our past trips have included chartered trains to the Grand Canyon, Eureka, Nevada, Montana, Colorado, and the Deschutes River in Oregon. We have also conducted field trips to various railroad installations, such as classification yards and historic repair shops dating from the late 1800's. More recently we have hosted the 1992 and 1999 National Railroad Historical Society conventions, for which we ran trips behind Union Pacific's 844 and 3985, and Southern Pacific's 2472 and 4449.

2006 – Feather River Express via ex-Western Pacific tracks through the scenic Feather River Canyon.

2008, 2010 – San Diego Steam Special, from Los Angeles via the ex-Santa Fe Surf Line behind steam locomotive AT&SF 3751.

2011 – Northern California Explorer, circle trip from Emeryville to Klamath Falls via the ex-Western Pacific Inside Gateway and the Shasta Route.

2012 – Grand Canyon Limited, round trip from Los Angeles to the Grand Canyon behind steam locomotive AT&SF 3751.

Publications: The chapter publishes a monthly bulletin, The Ferroequinologist (Student of the Iron Horse). Members also receive the National Railway Bulletin, which is a glossy magazine published quarterly.

Meetings: Programs of historical interest 7:30 pm on the third Friday of every month (except February). Annual banquet on the third Saturday in February. All meetings are held at the Santa Clara CALTRAIN Depot, 1005 Railroad Avenue at Franklin, Santa Clara, California. You are cordially invited to attend meetings and participate in activities.
